Since its founding in 2001, Art with a Heart in Healthcare (AWAHIH) has served more than 100,000 patients and their families at several locations in Jacksonville, FL including Wolfson Children's Hospital, Nemours Children's Health, Baptist Medical Center, and Mayo Clinic. Six days a week, AWAHIH's team of professional artists, volunteers and interns develop sessions individualized to meet the needs of patients and families at the bedside or in groups.




ART SESSIONS

AT THE BEDSIDE AND IN GROUPS

Art sessions offered at patients' bedsides are the heart of Art with a Heart in Healthcare's (AWAHIH) mission. Our team of Artists-in-Residence meet patients where they are, transforming their dreary hospital rooms into vibrant art studios and galleries. In addition, patients and their families have the option to join our artists and other patients for art sessions in hospital playrooms. Having the opportunity to escape the confines of their rooms, exercise their imagination, and socialize with others has a significant impact on patients' healing process and hospital experience. From creating a custom piece of jewelry to painting a soothing ocean scene, making art alleviates stress, reduces perceptions of pain, and provides a source of enjoyment. Moreover, AWAHIH provides patients in pediatric, adult, and geriatric behavioral health units with art and handpan music sessions. Mental illness is at an all time high; it is more important than ever for patients to express themselves in a

safe and creative way.


